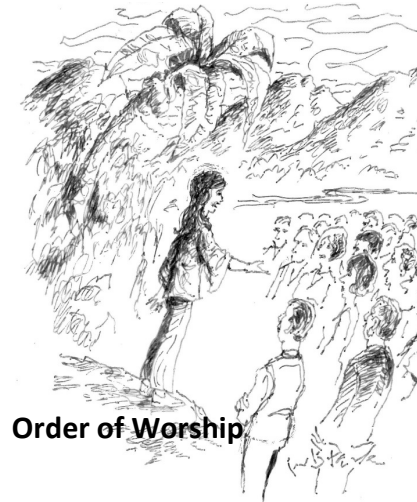

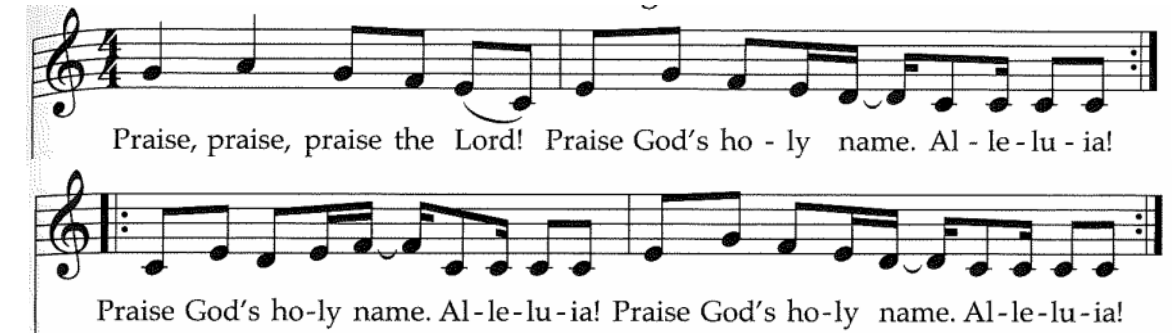

MADAGASCAR: Total \$4,500 DAN AND ELIZABETH TURK

There are two projects with which Dan and Elizabeth Turk work. They are Park Lake Presbyterian Church missionaries, serving in Madagascar, which is one of the poorest countries in the world. Over 90% of the population is living on less than \$2 a day. Elizabeth is a community health nurse and the daughter of retired missionaries, Bill and Nancy Warlick. Dan has his PhD in forestry. They work with the Church of Jesus Christ in Madagascar/FJKM. (FKJM, *The Church of Jesus Christ in Madagascar* is the second-largest Christian denomination in

Madagascar). Elizabeth will be one of our guest speakers on **Friday, February 22, 6:00 pm** at the International Pot Luck dinner, Silent Auction and “Buy-it-Now” tag sale.

TREE NURSERIES: \$2,500

Fruit trees offer a way out of hunger and poverty. Families can raise and eat the fruit produced, as well as sell the fruits to earn money. Dan works with the FJKM’s fruit, vegetables, and the Environmental Education Project (FVEE) which is a collaborative effort of the PC(USA) and FJKM churches to help decrease poverty in Madagascar as a witness to God’s love. This program is a **Two Cents-A-Meal** recipient of Central Florida Presbytery hunger outreach. (cfpresbytery.org)



HIV/AIDS: \$2,000

The HIV/AIDS rate is still low in Madagascar and the FJKM church is working hard to keep it that way. The FJKM has a national AIDS Committee that is working to educate church members about HIV & AIDS and how to prevent it. It also works to educate the church about the importance of caring for those living with HIV and not discriminating against them. Elizabeth serves on this committee. Not many people are getting tested for HIV because there is a stigma involved. So FJKM has made it a priority to test and reach out to people who are HIV positive & who don’t know it. Treatment for HIV is free in Madagascar, but if people don’t know they are positive, they can’t get treatment. So the government is asking all groups involved in the fight against HIV-AIDS to promote citizens getting tested.

A native of Rwanda, East Africa, **Ebralie Mwizerwa** moved to Nashville several years ago to become part of the First Presbyterian Church of Nashville congregation.

Ebralie earned a B.A. in Business Administration and Management from Daystar University in Nairobi, Kenya and a M.A. in Economics from Vanderbilt University in Nashville, TN.

She joined The Outreach Foundation 15 years ago where she devotes her time focusing on strengthening communication with global mission partners, projects development and implementation, as well as projects monitoring and evaluation, advising partners for self reliance and accountability. Ebralie worked for churches in Africa for over 10 years in various management roles before moving to Nairobi after surviving the 1994 genocide in Rwanda.

Her desire is to see vulnerable communities reaching a more sustainable life. She travels frequently to Africa, including Zambia, Zimbabwe, Uganda and Kenya, as well as her native Rwanda. She has a particular passion for children and women: cornerstones for developing a nation and reaching quality of life for families. She believes God called her, equipped and blessed her to proclaim the Good News that transforms lives and impacts communities.

U.P. (UNITED AGAINST POVERTY): \$2,200

Their purpose is to inspire and empower people living in poverty to lift themselves up and their families to economic self-sufficiency. Their mission is to serve those in poverty by providing crisis care, case management, transformative education, food and household subsidy, employment training and placement, personal empowerment training and active referrals to other collaborative social service providers. The **United Against Orlando** representative, Executive Director, Eric Gray, will be our guest speaker during Mission Fair Week on **Wednesday, February 20 at 6:00 pm**, Entrée: Chili with breads and dessert. GRACE MEDICAL HOME: \$2,200

Their mission is to be a medical home reflecting the heart of Christ by offering the highest level of health care to those in our community who need it most. Grace Medical Home is a non-profit medical home serving the working uninsured residents of Orange County who reside at or below 200% of the federal poverty line. Volunteers, staff and generous donors make it possible for Grace Medical Home to provide comprehensive adult and pediatric care. Patients pay a yearly registration fee as well as a fixed fee at each visit. Fees are based on a sliding scale. Currently almost one in four in Central Florida lacks medical insurance. Grace Medical Home wants to close the gap between those who enjoy quality medical care and those who do not. (gracemedicalhome.org)



ZEBRA COALITION: \$1,000

The Zebra Coalition is a network of organizations which provide services and support for LGBTQ youth ages 13-24. The Coalition assists young people facing homelessness, bullying, isolation from their families and physical, sexual and drug abuse with individualized programs to guide them to recovery and stability. 18% of the nation’s homeless youth are in Florida. (zebrayouth.org)

These blessing bags are made available by the youth of our church for members of the congregation to hand out to people in need. We are thankful for what our youth provide.

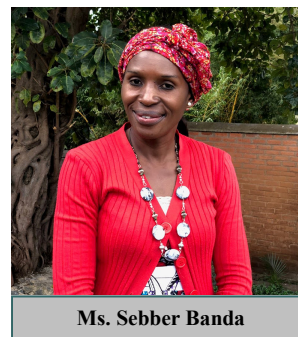
BUSANZA VOCATIONAL CENTER, RWANDA: \$1,000

The Busanza community was deeply affected by the genocide in 1994 in Rwanda. This is a poor area where the government resettled widows and orphans as well as returnees after the genocide. The Church is growing by leaps and bounds in the area. The Training Center is comprised of a Vocational School for both men and women. There is also a school for special needs children that the Church administers in the area. This Center aspires to teach young people the skills needed to get jobs and care for themselves and for families as well as to help educate children with special needs.

TETE PROVINCE, MOZAMBIQUE: Total \$4,500

CHURCH CONSTRUCTION: \$2,500

Currently, there are three Presbyterian congregations who have been approved by the local presbytery committee for funding. The church members have molded and burned bricks, gathered sand and stones, dug pits to hold water. These congregations have worked hard to be able to have a permanent place to worship. 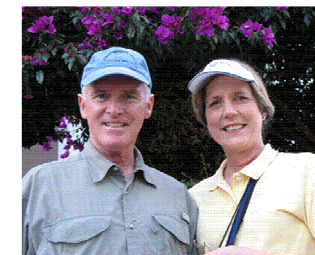
Ms. Sebber Banda

MS. SEBBER BANDA: \$2,000

Sebber provides birthing kits for traditional villages and birth attendants. Sebber is one of Park Lake’s missionaries who is now in charge of the Tete Province holistic evangelism & training ministry. She travels and teaches, as well as trains leaders who work in the community for better health. She is a midwife and a community health nurse. She educates communities about health issues and uses the ministry of a dynamic drama team to help teach the village people in a visual way.
