

A Litany of Freedom

Then the Lord said, "I have observed the misery of my people who are in Egypt; I have heard their cry on account of their taskmasters. (Exodus 3:7)

"Indeed, I know their sufferings, and I have come down to deliver them from the Egyptians, and to bring them up out of that land to a good and broad land, a land flowing with milk and honey... (Exodus 3:7,8)

"The cry of the Israelites has now come to me; I have also seen how the Egyptians oppress them. (Exodus 3:9)

"So come, I will send you to Pharaoh to bring my people, the Israelites, out of Egypt." (Exodus 3:10)

In this year of jubilee you shall return, every one of you, to your property. You shall observe my statutes and faithfully keep my ordinances, so that you may live on the land securely. (Leviticus 25:13)
