



LIVING AND DYING IN CHRIST

821 My Life Flows On How Can I Keep from Singing? life flows on in end-less song, a-bove earth's lam-en - ta - tion. 2 Through all the tu-mult and the strife, I hear that mu-sic ring-ing. 3 What though my joys and com-forts die? I know my Sav-ior liv - eth. peace of Christ makes fresh my heart, a foun-tain ev - er spring-ing! hear the clear, though far-off hymn that hails a new cre - a - tion. finds an ech - o in my soul. How can I keep from sing-ing? What though the dark-ness gath-er round? Songs in the night he giv-eth. things are mine since I am his! How can I keep from sing-ing? Refrain No storm can shake my in-most calm while to that Rock I'm cling-ing. Since Christ is Lord of heaven and earth, how can I keep from sing-ing?

In the New York Observer of August 7, 1868, this text was titled "Always Rejoicing," and was attributed to "Pauline T." This may well be where the Baptist pastor and musician to whom it is usually credited encountered the words that he later published with his tune.
