

July 15, 2020: *Hero Central* Pentecost Bible Story

What do you think the people in the story were thinking when the wind blew, and they saw flames floating above their heads?



Option 1: Wind and Fire Streamers Supplies:


- Crepe paper streamers, tissue paper cut into strips or ribbon.
 Yellow, orange, red fire
 - Blue and white wind
- Craft sticks or pencil
- Scissors
- Tape
- 1. Cut different colors of streamers, tissue paper or ribbon into 12-inch-long strips.
- 2. Tape them onto the end of a pencil or a craft stick.
- 3. Tell your family the story about Pentecost.



Option 2: Pentecost Flame Headband

Supplies:

- Three Flame Template
- Crayons, markers or colored pencils
- Scissors
- Orange, yellow or red construction paper
- Glue or tape
- 1. Print the Three Flame Template.
- 2. Color the three flames with red, orange and yellow markers, crayons or colored pencils.
- 3. Cut out the flame pieces and glue them together, layering them red, orange and yellow.
- 4. Measure and cut two strips of red, orange or yellow construction paper, 2 inches wide and 11 inches long. Tape the two ends together. This will become the headband. Measure the strips around your head to make sure it is the correct size. Tape the other two ends together.
- 5. Glue or tape the flames onto the headband.








Option 3: Flame Window Art – version 1 Supplies:

- Flame Template
- Tissue paper yellow, orange, red
- One piece of 8 ½ x 11 black construction paper or card stock
- Scissors
- One piece 8 ½ x 11 clear contact paper
- 1. Using the Flame Template, trace and cut out the outline of the flame on the black construction paper.
- 2. Cut the yellow, orange and red tissue paper into small 1-inch squares.
- 3. Arrange the black flame outline on the sticky side of the contact paper.
- 4. Starting with the red pieces of tissue paper at the bottom of the flame, layer the orange and the yellow at the top until you fill in the black flame outline.
- 5. Place the other half of the contact paper on top of the completed flame. Your flame art will be sandwiched in between the two pieces of contact paper.
- 6. Cut out the flame shape and hang in your window to remind you of the Pentecost story.







Option 4: Flame Window Art – version 2 (supplies as above except no contact paper and add glue)

- 1. Using the Flame Template, trace and cut out the shape of the flame on the black construction paper.
- 2. Cut the yellow, orange and red tissue paper into small 1-inch squares.
- 3. Using a glue stick, arrange the tissue pieces on the black flame shape. Begin at the bottom using the red, then orange and then yellow. Scrunch the tissue paper before gluing onto the black construction paper to give it a textured look.
- 4. Hang in your window, on the refrigerator or in your room to remind you of the Pentecost story.
