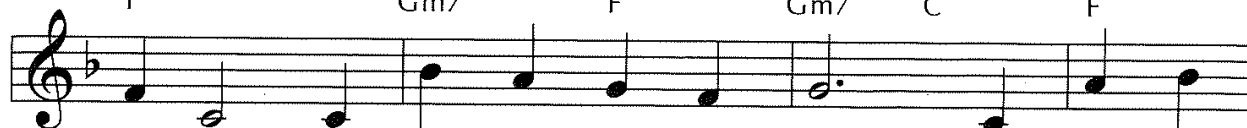

Spir - it of the liv - ing God, fall a - fresh on me.

The first system of music consists of a treble and bass staff in 4/4 time, key of B-flat major. The treble staff features a melody with eighth and quarter notes, while the bass staff provides a harmonic accompaniment with chords and moving lines.

Spir - it of the liv - ing God, fall a - fresh on me.

The second system of music continues the melody and accompaniment from the first system, maintaining the same musical structure and lyrics.

The third system of music features a more active melody in the treble staff, with eighth and sixteenth notes, and a steady accompaniment in the bass staff. The lyrics are: "Melt me; mold me; fill me; use me."



In both Hebrew and Greek, the words for "spirit" can equally well be translated as "breath" or "wind," so it is very appropriate to address the Holy Spirit as the "Breath of God." This tune by an English organist has become the customary one in North American hymnals.
