Thank you Adventurers, for bringing in school supplies to donate to Washington Shores Elementary school. Friday is our last day to bring in backpacks and school supplies, or cash donations this week.





Today, in Bible time, the Adventurers, heard the Lost Parable stories from Luke 15.

In the **PreK-4 class**, we acted out the part of the story of the son coming home and his father was so joyful!

For our Science project, we mixed baking soda and vinegar to create carbon dioxide to inflate a balloon. We also used the same mix to shoot the top off a little plastic container. During Snack time, we ate a yummy treat of graham crackers and popcorn that looked like a sheep! In **Recreation**, we ran a "Lost" relay, passing sheep, coin and lost son (Stuffed animal, disc and ball) over head then running to the end of the line to keep going. Another game we played was No Peak Catch sitting down with a sheet between teams and catching the ball. We played clean up your room with lots of little balls all over and cleaning them up into the garbage can. In crafts, we made a cross ornament with Model Magic and

decorated them with colorful beads.
