Co-pastor Corner

What It Means to Say "I Believe"

Over the past 2 months, we have enjoyed working with our new class of confirmands to explore faith and the expressions of Christian faith over the past 2 centuries. It's an interesting practice to put yourself in the shoes of a young believer who is arriving at the point where they are acknowledging what they believe about God, Jesus, and the dynamic power of God's Spirit in their lives. As I wrote to the parents in a recent email, when these 6 youth join the Church, they are not doing so as a completion, but as a beginning, a commencement as Dan preached about recently. They will stand on their own in matters of faith and speak their own words. They will be accepting the love of God in their lives for themselves and wrestling with God in their own hearts. They will respond to the call of Jesus Christ to be His hands and feet in the world – feeding the hungry; showing kindness to the broken; speaking out against injustices. We have been asking you to pray for them. I hope you have been. I hope you will continue to do so because this life of faith is countercultural, and the road is often lonely.

In a professional magazine for preachers, I read two truths which I believe are true for all of us who believe in Jesus. The first is that in this post-pandemic season that we are living in Christians are under a new stress. The Good News that we love and speak about is oftentimes overwhelmed by the street noise of cynicism and tentative uncertainty. The second truth is that we are surrounded by creative, powerful and compelling messages of hope and love. In times which have shaken us to the core, people still remind one another of the Good News of the Gospel and walk with one another toward paths of faithful discipleship. Yes, we are under stress. Yes, the Gospel is still finding a voice and creating a way. The Church at its best is that place that both acknowledges the struggle, keeps listening for the voice of God, and continues to live out what we hear through our words and our actions.

Our time with our Park Lake youth has me thinking a lot about what it means to say, "I believe." It was only after having spent time with Jesus, watching him heal the blind, cure the deaf, feed crowds of people from very little... in other words, only after having witnessed the power and presence of God, was Peter able to stand up against opposing voices to say that he believed Jesus was God's Messiah. So "I believe" is accompanied by the experience of having seen and heard. Such faith matures over time as we trust God more and more.

So, pray for our youth with me. They are asking a lot of questions about who God is and what God has to do with their lives. Pray for God to wrestle with them and hold them. Pray for their trust in God even when they are not clear about what God can do in their lives. Pray for a holy relationship that matures and deepens in sweet ways.


