CO-PASTOR'S CORNER

Getting Back to Basics

Dan and I shaped summer worship around a sermon series on the Great Stories of the Faith, found in Genesis 11- 49. One of the things I've enjoyed most is that it's a retelling of where we came from as people of God. We've been able to ask: What did God want with us in the first place? Did the first believers have it easier than I do? Where is God when bad things happen?



What if I mess up- is God done with me?

We have explored the lives of those that God chose to establish as His presence in the world. It has been a journey of remembering and discovering good and heartbreaking stories of human beings and the determination and grace of God in all of our lives. We have delved into the lives of Abraham and Sarah who laughed over the prospect of having a baby in their old age. And how that son Isaac was beloved over the older son Ishmael and nearly offered as a sacrifice by his loving father Abraham. We sat in the desert with Ishmael and his mother Hagar who were shunned by extended family, but not forgotten by God. Isaac's wife Rachel had a complicated pregnancy when the twins she carried in her belly wrestled with one another. Those twins Jacob and Esau who would continue to battle outside the womb for love and blessing. God renames Jacob (heel grabber), giving him the name **Israel** and we begin to see into the future story of the 12 sons becoming the 12 tribes of Israel. This is not the end of the story. What follows is the enslavement of Israel within the Egyptian empire, and God choosing another man, Moses, to bring them out, take them on a journey as they relearn who they are as God's people, and establish them in the land promised so many years before.

Perhaps the Great Stories of the Faith can be described as a comprehensive story of love and blessing, struggling and being found. Oh, how this is our story today.

What are some takeaways that stand out for me?

- God's Call is to engage God calls and Abraham responds by following.
- God promises to establish in and for Abraham (and his descendents) a place, a people, and a purpose (a home, a family and work to do).
- God is faithful to God's promise and we can trust that.
- God will make a way in spite of the messes we either make or encounter in life.
- God's promise is not just for one man they are to establish us as God's people and to have a relationship with each one of us.

Getting back to basics has a way of grounding and preparing us. Blessings to you wherever you are in life's transitions and may you know God's blessing and love guiding you along the way.



Please visit the Park Lake Library, located downstairs in the Sanctuary building. We have many interesting books to explore. The whole North wall of the library is about the Bible and the books of the Bible. There are reference books, commentaries and investigations of the individual books of the Bible. Collections such as <u>The Interpreters Bible</u>, there are many different translations of the Bible and books about the lands of the Bible times.



There is a book that may humble us "Bible scholars". I recommend, <u>The Complete Bible Quiz Book</u>, by Carlinsky (220.07 CAR). Some interesting questions I found in this book are:

- #537. Where did Jesus get the loaves and fishes to feed the multitude, according to John?
- #538. How was Jesus addressed by the two blind me he cured? Was it, a) Sire b) O Lord c) Thou son of David or d). Mr. Messiah.
