Commissioning Youth and Adults Montreat Youth Conference

One: "The people who walk in darkness have seen a great light; those who lived in a land of deep darkness - on them light has shined." Isaiah 9:2

All: Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path." Psalm 119:105

One: "The light was shining in the darkness and the darkness did not overcome it." John 1:5

All: Jesus said, "I am the Light of the world, whoever follows me will never walk in darkness but will have the light of life." John 8:12

One: To the youth, whose vision and hearing are so much sharper than they'll ever be again, as you begin your week in Montreat, I encourage you to watch and listen for the ways God will be calling each of you: in worship, in play, in small group discussions and informal conversations, in friendships new and old, and in the natural beauty of God's creation. Remember: God doesn't call you only as an individual but as members of the body of Christ and representatives of this congregation—and so I urge you to also listen to the voices of your adult leaders, who will be there to guide and support you, offer advice, and keep you safe.

To you adult leaders, accompanying the youth to Montreat, I counsel you to take your role as guide and support, as mentor, as protector seriously. And I also encourage you to listen for God's particular call to you: in worship, in play, in small group discussions and informal conversations, in friendships new and old, in the natural beauty of God's creation—and in the voices of these young people.

To all of you, youth and adults: God's grace has been poured out on you in baptism and as members of the body of Christ. And it is by God's grace we are saved and given the strength to grow in faith and to serve Christ. Today, God has called you to grow in faith, learning, and fellowship by participating in the Montreat Youth Conference. Show that you intend to answer that call by answering these questions:

One: As you begin your journey, will you be Christ's faithful disciple, obeying his Word and showing his love?

Youth and Adults: I will

One: Do you welcome the responsibility of representing Park Lake, and will you seek to follow Christ in all that you do and say at Montreat?

Youth and Adults: I do and I will.

To the congregation:

One: Do you, members and worshipers with Park Lake, commit to pray for our sisters and brothers while they experience a time in a thin place, growing in their faith in Christ, in learning, and in fellowship with the wider community of Christ at Montreat?

ALL: We do.

One: Will you welcome them warmly when they return, and pester them enthusiastically for stories about their experience?

ALL: We will!

One: Let us pray. Faithful God, in baptism you claimed us; and by your Holy Spirit you are working in our lives, empowering us to live a life worthy of our calling. We thank you for leading Ali, Tatumn, Daet, Grayson, and Aaron, Mackenzie and Helen to this time and place. Support them with Your traveling mercies; ground them in your truth and guide them by your Holy Spirit, so that in their participation in the Montreat Youth Conference, they may grow in faith, hope, and love and be faithful disciples of Jesus Christ, in whose name we pray. Amen.

Friends, you are commissioned as representatives of the body of Christ in this place to the Montreat Youth Conference. Whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God through him. Amen
