#### **Co-Pastors Corner**



Dear Park Lake Presbyterian Church Family,

These are my reflections as an adult leader for our PLPC youth at the Montreat Youth Conference. There are many big and small elements to leading a trip: rallying the troops to find out who is going; registering with the conference; securing housing; securing someone to co-lead and cook; getting appropriate permission and health slips signed and in hand; securing transportation; preparing the youth for the trip by

orienting them to the conference theme and writing a covenant intention for the week. On the morning of, youth and families and the week's adult leaders met in the Park Lake parking lot at 6:30 am. We loaded bags, pillows and snacks, took a group picture, had a circle prayer for God's grace and traveling mercies, hugged parents and got into the vans.

Then we drive. It is 596 miles to Montreat. The youth sleep most of the way, while the drivers press through interstate traffic that is a mixture of speedway and slow crawl, and keep their Diet Mountain Dews and espresso drinks constantly refreshed. As I-26 weaves out of South Carolina into North, the beautiful Blue Ridge mountains rise into view. This is the sign that we are almost at our home for the next week. I always wake sleeping youth to take in this majestic view. The beauty of the mountains is awesome and mesmerizing, especially for flatlanders such as ourselves. Maybe that's the place of transition, even for leaders. The checklist is done and now the experience begins.



Our conference theme was inspired by Psalm 119:105 "Thy word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path." We adopted this theme for youth Sunday at Park Lake to ready our minds and hearts for the conference. Our Park Lake group stayed in a cottage in Montreat and walked 7/10ths of a mile back and forth to our activities. We sang and danced with 800 other youth and their leaders, were challenged and encouraged by the keynote leader and preacher. We trekked up the hill to small groups twice a day. Small groups were

divided into 25-30 all from different cities and churches. We played rec games and ate ice cream and french fries at "the Huck". At the end of each day, 10 p.m. (!), we met with our back home group to recap what we'd seen, heard and experienced. We asked how God was moving? What did the preacher say that left an impression with you? Who did you meet?

On Wednesday afternoon, we took our free afternoon and went to the Black Mountain Children's Home in Swannanoa. September of 2024, after Hurricane Helene left damage on Florida's west coast, it crisscrossed the state and came back inland into North Carolina, leaving flooding, landslides, washed out roads and communities. The Asheville area was hit hard, and Swannanoa among the hardest. You would have been so proud of our youth. They rolled up their figurative sleeves and went to work hauling logs and wheelbarrows to clear a section of road. They worked joyfully and as a team. It is one of their favorite memories of the trip. Talk about a light to my own path. Our youths' 'can-do' spirit provided that.

I have taken this trip to Montreat with youth groups for more than 40 years. I attended Montreat as a youth myself, as did my grandmother with her mother in the early 1900s. For me, it was a formative time of God's presence, and shaped my faith as a young adult and gave me lifelong friendships. That's why I continue to want our youth to experience it. Perhaps in thin, set-apart places, when the noise of day-to-day life dies down, and electronics are less intrusive, our young might find themselves face to face with God in ways that will shape them too.

This year, I am grateful to the youth for taking the risk to do something out of the ordinary from what their peers might do. To Mackenzie Bertram for her leadership. To parents for trusting us with your kids. There's more to share with you. I'll look for ways to do that.

While Park Lake's 2025 Centennial celebration has been full of fun, interesting and meaningful events – from architectural tours to ice cream socials – the Centennial Committee wanted to include a component of giving. Mission work has always been a cornerstone of our commitment to the church and our community, and surely it should be included now.

Two things really stand out as we look back at May. The 100 hours were to include unique outreach opportunities, not including the amazing mission work we do year in and out. These were special missions designed to involve as many in our congregation as possible. Secondly, it can't be stressed enough how gladly 72 members of Park Lake participated in the five main events, many volunteering at more than one or even two or more. Thanks to that generosity of spirit, each opportunity, while involving time-consuming and hard work, was fun and provided great fellowship.

#### Here's how we spent our time:

May 3: No Child Hungry – To fight childhood hunger, more than 45 members and friends packed 10,500 meals.

May 9: Blessing Bag Assembly – 15 of our members and friends at Westminster Towers put together 157 blessing bags.

May 12: Grace Medical Home – A group of 13 gathered at Grace Medical Home to both serve the staff lunch and clean the dental area.

May 17: Spruce Up Park Lake Presbyterian Church – 30 members did the hard work of spiffing up Park Lake Presbyterian Church both inside and out to make us proud during our Centennial year.

We give a special shout out to Renee Riegler, who volunteered at each event and to Gary Lelvis, who was a close second. We also recognize our volunteers at the ends of the age spectrum: Eva Hampton at 3 years old and Ginny Porter at 95. And we thank everyone who helped organize each event and volunteered their time and hard work. God is Good!


