

In June, when our senior high and some middlers attended the Montreat BLACK MOUN AIN Youth Conference, we took our "free afternoon" on Wednesday to go into Swannanoa to help with mission work. The Black Mountain Home for Children GLORIFYING GOD BY CARING FOR CHILDREN, has been in existence for over 120 years.

In the Fall 2024, Hurricane Helene left that area devastated from rains and flooding. Many cabins and roads at the Children's Home were washed out. Our Park Lake youth spent the afternoon dragging brush and limbs to help clear sections of roadways. We were so proud of their amazing energy and enthusiasm for such a big task! On Wednesday August 20, the Christian Service Center introduced the new 407 Connect program, designed to expand emergency sleeping capacity and connect individuals to permanent housing.

407 Connect will operate two custom-built buses, each equipped with up to 21 climate-controlled sleeping pods,

onboard restrooms, and secure storage for personal belongings. At full capacity, the program will offer 42



adults and children a place to rest safely and with dignity each night. Park Lake's generosity makes bold, transformative efforts like this possible. Thank you for helping the Christian Service Center move forward with purpose and faith. Together, we are offering not only a safe place for tonight but hope for tomorrow.



The 2025–2026 PW/Horizons Bible Study FINDING RESILIENCE, JOY AND OUR IDENITY IN JESUS CHRIST



On August 2nd, Jane Callahan and Marian Price attended the Bible Study kick-off for the 2025-2026 study.

In this Bible study, we will explore resilience. This is modeled for us by several biblical characters, gospel and epistle writers, as well as Jesus. So, what exactly is resilience? Resilience is the ability to spring back into shape and to adapt well in the face of adversity, trauma, tragedy, threats, or stress—such as from family, relationships, health, workplace, and financial stressors. People who survive and thrive well in change are resilient. The Bible study is also about joy. How do we find joy in a chaotic world? Christian joy may be different from how a lot of people define joy.



Joy is sometimes confused with happiness. For Christians, joy can occur while we are in the midst of difficult circumstances. Joy is the second fruit of the spirit, preceded by love and followed by peace (Gal 5:22-23). Trusting in God when we are in trying times can fill us with glorious joy and peace. We have joy in our suffering, because ultimately our joy is found in Jesus Christ.

We will also seek to rediscover our identity. Identity is more than who we are or who we show ourselves to be. At its core, it points to our humanity. Our core identity is not found in our titles, our positions, our spouses, our partners, or our possessions. For Christians, our identity is found in Jesus Christ.
