

WORLD FOOD DAY

Today, October 19, we are celebrating World Food Day. Rev. Eugene Cho, President of Bread for the World, reminds us that God has called us to be faithful as we



pray, serve and take action on behalf of children and families in our community and around the world living with hunger. He states that approximately 783 million people worldwide are facing chronic hunger, struggling to put food on their table. Here in the U.S., one in five children lives in poverty! Sadly, these statistics are on track to get worse. Between cuts to Medicaid, SNAP, and foreign aid, millions more of our neighbors (including millions of children) will be facing hunger. We must pray, speak up, in our collective voice, and let our lawmakers know that we need them to take action." We must put our faith into action. Rev. Cho adds, "By working together we can make a difference...and right now, we must pray more. Let us pray for our leaders, that they will hear the needs of people experiencing hunger. Let us pray for each other, that we may not grow weary in acting to change the circumstances that allow hunger to persist. Let us pray for people experiencing hunger, that they may be fed."
