

NAPKIN IDEAS

MISSION and HOTEL PROPERTY

- A church that serves the poor among us with housing in a town and time where shelter and public transport are so important and government cannot do it without our help and Lobbying.
- Continue to build beachheads in the greater community. Places to meet people's needs.
- Idea: Use the front part of the hotel building to provide low income housing.
- Shelters for homeless.
- Convert Motel property fronting on Colonial Drive.
- Convert Motel property fronting on Colonial Drive into housing for homeless, including Zebra Youth.
- PLPC can partner with Zebra Youth and the Homeless Services Network to bring motel rooms up to code to house homeless youth. \$\$\$
- Turn the Hotel into Housing for Foster Kids who have aged out of foster care. (Bob Blue's idea.)
- Could we do more with, for the unhoused? What about these buses the city is getting that folks will sleep in? Can they park in our parking lot at night?
- Orlando will have the lowest inequality of any metro area in the USA.

A Parish Associate is an ordained pastor who is engaged in validated ministry outside of the local church, in Linda's case she has been a hospital chaplain with the Advent Health system. Our presbytery encourages ordained pastors to also connect with and be active in a local church, even as they continue to serve the community through their validated ministries.



Twenty-three years ago, Dan and I asked Linda if she would be Park Lake's Parish Associate. As Parish Associate, Linda has richly blessed our own ministry as a cherished colleague, wise support, trusted preacher and teacher. She has led worship several times each year, most notably when we were out of town during the Pulse tragedy, and when we were incapacitated by the Covid19 virus - on an Easter Sunday, of all things. Over the years, Linda has stepped in to provide pastoral care in many instances. Linda always brings thoughtful and compassionate leadership, and never more than in times of great need.

Linda is an active member of the Central Florida Presbytery, and over the years has served in many capacities within the presbytery as pastor, associate pastor, committee leader, supply preacher, and teacher. At Park Lake she has facilitated creative projects such as the Park Lake Page Turners book group, VBS Mission Offerings, the knitting group, and the Blessing of Pets. Linda has provided guidance and support for GayStraight@ParkLake. She has taught in education circles of all ages, with adult education being her great love. Linda's bright, compassionate, pastoral, creative and very capable ministry style makes her an outstanding servant leader of our Lord. Now, her ministry has been honed by her counseling skills. Completing another Master's Degree, this time in counseling, Linda is in active ministry as a licensed mental health counselor.

2024 and 2025. Thank you to the Church Life Committee team for putting together the luncheon and presentation. We welcome 2024


